

*5 Easy Steps to Helping
Feral Cats in our Community*

1. Determine whether the cats are stray or feral.
2. Get advice, support and equipment for participating in Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) through Veneta Friends of Ferals as part of the "Please Don't Litter" project.
3. Schedule an appointment for the spay/neuter surgery with one of the participating veterinarian clinics.
4. Trap the cats and transport them to the clinic on the day of the scheduled surgery.
5. Foster the cats for 1-3 days while they recover from the surgery.
6. Return the cats to the same place you trapped and provide simple, care.



Approximately 500 feral and stray cats currently call Veneta home.

Helping feral cats can be very rewarding and there are many ways you can be involved.

Veneta Friends of Ferals is a volunteer organization made up of citizens that are committed to improving the lives of feral cats through proper implementation of the City's Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program.

TNR Program studies have proven that a well organized TNR program is the single most successful method of stabilizing and maintaining healthy feral cat colonies with the least possible cost to local governments and residents, while providing the best life for the animals themselves.

"Please Don't Litter" is a two-year campaign funded by a grant from PetSmart Charities® that targets feral and stray cats. During 2014 and 2015, volunteers and City staff will provide educational material about the benefits of spaying/neutering cats, promote spaying and neutering with posters and advertising and follow established TNR program procedures in identifying, trapping, altering and returning feral and stray cats within the 97487 zip code.

What Can I Do?

Volunteers assist with identifying colonies, setting and checking traps, transporting feral cats to and from the clinic, post-surgery care and ongoing colony observation.

Volunteers also advise and train business owners, housing development managers and homeowners on caring for feral cats.
